2025 Federal Legislative Agenda

The Iowa Food Bank Association (IFBA) is comprised of six trusted Feeding America food banks that work together to:

- Ensure that lowans have enough to eat to stay healthy and productive
- Educate and advocate for policies that eliminate food insecurity
- Efficiently and effectively serve lowans facing hunger

TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program)

Increase TEFAP funding in the Farm Bill to help individuals facing hunger and support the U.S. agricultural economy by:

- Reauthorizing and increasing mandatory funding for TEFAP food purchases
- Increasing annual discretionary funding for TEFAP storage and distribution by \$200 million
- Reauthorizing \$15 million in annual discretionary funding for TEFAP infrastructure grants
- Requesting Congress increase the TEFAP Farm to Food bank Program by removing the state match and allow states to prioritize programs

Protect SNAP

Congress should ensure SNAP purchasing power in the Farm Bill remains strong, so benefits align with increasing grocery prices and provide support for individuals by:

- Helping more military families access SNAP benefits by excluding the Basic Allowance for Housing from the gross income calculation for eligibility
- Protecting SNAP choice and focus on affordable access to nutritious foods
